A man was walking on the beach when he noticed a young boy who kept leaning down, picking something up, and throwing it in the water. As he got closer, he realized that the boy was picking up the starfish that had been washed up on the shore and was throwing them back into the water one at a time, so that they wouldn't die.

Amused by the sight, the fellow told the boy that he was simply wasting his time. "There must be thousands of starfish on this beach and along the coast. You can't possibly get to all of them. Don't you see that you will never be able to make a real difference?"

The boy smiled, bent down, and picked up yet another starfish. As he threw it back into the sea, he replied, "Tell you what... it definitely made a difference to that one!"

We may look at the world and feel overwhelmed – so many people in pain, so many problems we can't solve, so many things beyond our reach. It's easy to think, what difference can our small actions possibly make? But we need to remember that every act of kindness, every word of encouragement, every sincere smile, creates a spark of light that can push back someone's darkness. These gestures may seem small, but to someone dried up on the shore, they can mean everything. While we may not be able to fix everything, that should never stop us from doing something.

And the same holds true in how we view ourselves – just as we must act kindly towards others, so must we treat ourselves with the same compassion. We sometimes get discouraged, thinking that because we aren't perfect, or because we struggle in certain areas, our efforts don't count, or they hold little to no value. We begin to convince ourselves that there's simply no point in trying. But this couldn't be further from the truth. Hashem does not ask us for perfection – He asks us for effort. You don't need to do everything for you to mean something. Hashem is very patient, and He cherishes every attempt – even the smallest. Every prayer whispered, every good deed, every inner battle fought quietly and alone – all of it matters deeply. In Hashem's eyes, your willingness to try is of infinite worth.

Every time we push ourselves to try again, every time we lift even one "starfish" from the shore of despair — whether in another person's life or in our own — it makes a difference. We must never get overwhelmed by the enormity of the task ahead, and we must never let what we can't do stop us from doing what we can. Perfection was never the goal — sincerity was. Each small step forward, each moment of effort, each act of goodness matters. The mere fact that you're trying, even when it's difficult, is infinitely precious to Hashem.

So keep going, keep caring, keep showing up. Keep throwing your starfish into the sea. Because sometimes, the smallest act can have the greatest impact. You may not see the full reach of your efforts, but in Heaven, every step, every struggle, every spark of sincerity is seen, counted, and cherished.
